NEUROPSYCHOLOGY. This APA accredited internship is designed to comply with Division 40/Houston Conference guidelines for internship training in neuropsychology. During this rotation, I completed one or two comprehensive neuropsychological assessments per week. Evaluations included primarily outpatient assessment of cognitive impairments related to dementia, movement disorders, traumatic brain injury, medical comorbidities, and psychiatric illnesses. Responsibilities included

interviewing veterans, developing flexible test batteries, administering/scoring and interpreting tests, reviewing the electronic medical record, writing reports, and providing patients and their families with feedback either on the same day or an agreed upon date two weeks later. I attended a weekly neuropsychology didactic and presented on feigning neurocognitive impairment, as well as attended weekly psychopharmacology didactics and relevant medical resident lectures and grand rounds. During my second and third rotations, I also completed additional supplemental neuropsychology experiences (1/2 -2 days/week). Further experiences included continued clinical experiences as well as specific knowledge building on varied neuropsychological topics, as well as additional didactics including shadowing of neurology, vascular studies, neuroimaging, and cognitive rehabilitation. I completed presentations/didactics to medical residents, an interdisciplinary psychopharmacology group, diversity group, and general mental health.
